Disaster Damage:

FEMA Disaster #1758 On May 20, 2008, President Bush issued a Presidential Disaster Declaration for Arkansas counties damaged by tornadoes and flooding from storms that hit the state beginning May 2nd. The following 12 counties were included in the disaster declaration: Arkansas, Benton, Cleburne, Conway, Crittenden, Grant, Lonoke, Mississippi, Phillips, Pulaski, Saline and Van Buren. Ongoing Damage Assessment Assessing the total financial needs of the state resulting from the disasters is a difficult and ongoing process. To determine the extent of damages in each county, the Arkansas Economic Development Commission (AEDC) received from the Arkansas Department of Emergency Management (ADEM) FEMA data, estimating the extent of public damages in each county by disaster. In addition, the AEDC solicited community and county damage information from each of the state's eight Planning and Economic Development Districts ("Districts"). In estimating the need for CDBG assistance in the affected counties, the AEDC will rely upon information supplied by FEMA, ADEM, and the mayors and county judges of Arkansas in conjunction with each district. Since the full extent of the state's needs cannot be determined at this time, the initial Action Plan will only outline the major categories for funding with estimated dollar amounts set aside for each District.

Recovery Needs:

Methodology Used to Distribute Funds A. Allocation Formula To insure that local needs are addressed in a timely and equitable manner, the state will rely on assistance from the eight Districts in the state. Because Arkansas's Districts have toured areas affected by the disasters and have maintained ongoing dialogue with every unit of local government affected by the 2008 disasters, they are therefore well qualified to inform the AEDC of local recovery needs. On February 5, 2009 the state held a meeting of key stakeholders to assist in the development of an equitable method to distribute CDBG supplemental appropriations. Attendees included representatives from each District, as well as representatives from the Arkansas Community Development Association (ACDA), the organization of Arkansas entitlement cities. Also in attendance were representatives from the IEA and ADFA. As a result of this meeting, a task force was established to assist in the development of a distribution method. The task force recommended that a formula be developed that would set aside funds for Districts to distribute to cities and counties within their geographic area. The proposed formula would use the following variables to determine the amount of money to set aside for each District. 1. The amount of Public Assistance (PA) damage assessed in each county by FEMA for disaster FEMA #1758 (50% of the scoring). 2. The percentage of low-to-moderate income (LMI) persons residing in each county as documented by the 2000 Census (25% of the scoring). 3. The number of LMI families residing in each county as documented by the 2000 Census (25% of the scoring). Based upon preliminary calculations* funding for all disasters would be distributed among Districts as follows: • Central Arkansas Planning & Development (Six counties) - \$953,765 • East Arkansas Planning & Development (Twelve counties) - \$1,250,328 • Northwest Arkansas Economic Development District (Nine counties) - \$293,763 • Southeast Arkansas Economic Development District (Ten counties) \$915,606 • West Central Arkansas Planning & Development (Ten counties) - \$374,867 • White River Planning & Development District (Ten counties) - \$722,078 Southwest Arkansas Planning and Development District and Western Arkansas Planning and Development District would receive no funding because none of their counties were included in the defined disaster area declared by FEMA #1758. *Note: These amounts exclude 5 percent of the allocations for administration costs. Adjustments to these amounts may be made should more reliable damage information become available. Pre-Application Process The task force also reviewed and approved a one-page pre-application form developed by AEDC that cities and counties would be required to complete to request disaster funding. To expedite the pre-application review process, the task force agreed with an AEDC recommendation that the Districts assist in the initial screening of projects for general compliance, eligibility and need. The pre-applications will then be forwarded to AEDC for scoring. The highest scoring applicants within each District will be invited by the AEDC to submit a full application for funding. The task force is currently developing scoring criteria based upon the following variables including, but not limited to: 1.

ty 2. Percentage of persons in the project area who are of low to moderate income 3. Extent of loss of housing units in the neighborhood community or county, especially those units affordable to low and moderate income persons 4. Time frame for completion of the project 5. Number of declared disasters affecting the county in 2008 6. Amount of total dollar damage affecting the applicant area Final variables and exact weighting of each variable will be determined by the task force at a later time, prior to initiation of the pre-application process. Counties and cities, including entitlement cities are eligible to submit pre-applications for funding consideration. All projects must meet a national objective and provide disaster relief, long-term recovery, or restore infrastructure. Any funds not used in any District may be transferred to another District at the discretion of the AEDC. Under no circumstances may funds duplicate other benefits.

Activity Description:

The project consists installing a storm water pump station in order to control flooding and improve drainage in the city of Jacksonport. The Ike II hurricane of 2008 resulted in major flooding and significant damage to several residents. The installation of a storm water pump near an existing flood gate in the levee would drain a 3,000+ acre area and would prevent flooding in the low lying areas. When the river rises to the point that the levee flood gate is closed, the pump will start to remove the water on the land side of the levee. The City of Jacksonport is in critical need for the pump station in order to control flooding and prevent drastic damage to the area. The project will benefit the entire populous of Jacksonport with 232 persons, of which 162 are LMI, resulting in a LMI of 69.8%.

Location Description:

The levee in Jacksonport, Jackson County, Arkansas

Activity Progress Narrative:

Due to the storms of 2008, the City of Jacksonport experienced extreme flooding which caused extensive damage to the town and houses. This CDBG grant installed a pump station with a concrete well wall and support structures to house the 15,000 CMP pump and 150 Hp motor. Stormwater is now pumped through a 24" pipe to the riverside of the levee. With the new stormwater pump, the residents of the town now have improved infrastructure in order to mitigate any future stormwater flooding. Of the 213 residents of the city, 162 are consider LMI for a benefit of 76.05%. This project was completed on 11/10/2016. This activity was closed 2/8/17. All funds were used to complete the project.

These two areas have been dealing with flooding issues as a direct result from the 2008 storms when several drainage ditches were washed out. The saturation of water caused homes, roads and the Woodruff County Nursing Home to become flooded, thus making it difficult to travel within the county. The project will provide service to 8,741 persons, 4,458 of which are low to moderate income resulting in a 51% low to moderate income benefit.

Location Description:

Drainage ditches located both north and south of the City of McCrory in Woodruff County, Arkansas.

Activity Progress Narrative:

As a direct result of the storms of 2008, Woodruff County experienced flooding as several drainage ditches were washed out. This caused homes, roads and a nursing home to become flooded. This grant reconstructed the drainage ditches located north and south of the City of McCrory by adding culverts, erosion control, cleaning out the brush and adding rip rap. The citizens of Woodruff County now have improved infrastructure which will mitigate flooding issues in the future. Woodruff County provided \$7,900 toward construction activities. The floods of 2008 served to deteriorate the streets to the point they must be reconstructed. The streets are covered with cracks and the pavement is not structurally sound. These two streets serve a densely populated residential area of the City and the Coty's only nursing home. The severely deteriorated condition of the streets slows access for emergency vehicles. A total of 4,219 persons are being served with 2,237 (53%) of them being LMI.

Dotley and Mark Streets, McGehee, Desha County, Arkansas

Activity Progress Narrative:

Due to the storms of 2008, the City of McGehee experienced floods which severly deteriorated Dotley and Mark Streets to the point where they were not structurally sound. These streets serve a densely populated area of the city and are a conduit for emergency vehicles and heavy traffic. The grant reconstructed these two streets by stabilizing the underlying soil base, adding cement to the subgrade and asphalting the surfaces. The 4219 people of McGehee, of whom 2,237 are considered LMI for a 53.02% benefit, now have safe streets. The project improved local infrastructure which will better withstand future flood events. The project was completed on 12/20/2013. The activity was closed on 3.3.2017. All funds were used for the project.
